
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April Presentation: Carli Schultz on the Tucson Gem, Mineral & Fossil Showcase

BRUCE McKAY – A long time CMAG member, Bruce McKay features a wide array of faceted gems, including a special selection of gems that are under \$20 each. Also a variety of cabochons. -- All three days

BURT CZAPSZYS – Another long time member, Burt features various cabochons of uncommon and unique materials and some faceted gems. -- Saturday and Sunday

CASCADE GEMS - Mostly faceted gems including Montana sapphire, spinel, sphene, chrysoberyl, garnet, Sunstone, quartz, topaz, tourmaline, peridot and some cabochons. -- All three days






DIY Corner - Rotary Tool Holder

I saw a picture for a rotary tool holder and had a thought: that looks like the cones that thread is spooled on for weaving. So I got one from my wife, Meg, drilled away and this was the result. I laid out the lines with a silver marker, adjusted the angle of the table on my drill press and drilled on the lines. Cones come in plastic and cardboard. I put a cardboard cone inside the plastic one to make it thicker. I will put it on a spinner to make it easier to find tools.

New Class! Forging with Andy Cooperman

Bang and Bend: Small-Scale Jewelry Forging

Teacher:	Andy Cooperman

Andy Cooperman makes all sorts of things from all sorts of things and is known for applying the rigor and discipline of Craft to a wide variety of often disparate materials. He has been a jeweler and metalsmith for over thirty years and a writer and educator for close to that. As a teacher, Andy's goal is to help students develop the creative problem-solving tools that will allow them to open new doors onto the creative process.

Forging—moving metal with a hammer—is one of the great joys of jewelry and metalsmithing and lies at its very heart. (The word "smith" in fact, is derived from "smite" which means "to strike".) A forged object can be uniquely lyrical and expressive. And forging can be combined with other processes to add pizazz and depth to almost any design.

This 3-day class will explore small-scale studio forging with a focus on rings. We'll get hammers swingin' working with some exercises in copper, brass and bronze and then move into sterling with the goal of finishing at least one wearable ring or object. The skills learned here can be applied across a spectrum of metals and scales.

Topics include simple model making, tapering, clean up and alternative forging methods. Students must have basic skills and be able to file, use the flex shaft, solder and anneal.

HOURS:

Friday – Sunday 10:00 AM – 5:00 PM PDT

EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS:

- Basic hand tools including saw, flat file and half round ring file.
- Small riveting or goldsmith's hammer (great for delicate areas).
- A hammer or two that you especially like and seems good for forging, like a ball peen or cross peen. Medium sized or even large. Gnarly is fine. No claw hammers.
- Ear protection. Earplugs are good, full coverage is better.
- Vise grips if you have them (medium size or large).
- Heavy round jaw pliers or even ring benders.
- Any flex shaft tools that you like, especially rubberized abrasives (and mandrels) and sanding discs, such as snap-ons, split mandrels, etc. The flex shafts will be provided by the studio.
- Sandpaper and flux.
- Benchtop anvils if you have one the studio has two large anvils, but if you prefer not to share, bring your own.
