Upcoming CMAG Programs

April: Traditional Japanese Metalsmithing Techniques - Nunome Inlay and Gilding (Momoko Okada)

Nunome means "woven cloth texture." Using special chisels and a hammer to create a cross-cut pattern on the surface of base metal, we then apply metal foil to the pattern. This technique was used on sword fittings in Japan, and more recently to decorate vases or incense burners. Here's a trailer about it.

Gilding Technique: This will cover the application process and making of metal flakes for a variety of Japanese colored silver leaf to add wonderful colors to finished metal jewelry!


Mokume Gane Ring Workshop with Eric Burris May 19-21, 2018

Registration open now for both CMAG Members and Non-Members.

Eric has been working with the Mokume Gane technique for 15 years. Drawn to the organic wood-like patterns, it is the primary material in his jewelry and the focus of his workshops. His goal is teaching jewelers and metalsmiths a low-tech, low-cost, and efficient method to making traditional diffusion bonded Mokume Gane. Fees - \$400 for CMAG members, \$475 for non-members. September 22-23, 2018 Making Multiples with Blanking Dies with Jayne Redman

\$250 for CMAG members, \$325 for non-members

Self registering, one piece blanking dies will give you the ability to quickly create multiples in metal sheet of the shapes you conceive, affording you the time to get lost in the design process and experiment with forming and assembling. Jayne Redman has been using this method for her own production jewelry for more than 20 years and has developed ways of creating dies and blanking multiples that dramatically speed up production. In this workshop you will learn how to develop patterns for this process and the method of sawing dies from flat stock tool steel. You will have the opportunity to make

combination silhouette/blanking dies and create relief forms using the hydraulic press. You will be amazed at how quickly you can go from original idea to duplicated shape as you make and use your own dies during class. Jayne will also be demonstrating her own inventive methods of forming, connecting, and engineering.
