## JULY PRESENTATION: Lori Gipson | The Metal Museum

Our July speaker will be Lori Gipson, the Director of Community Education and Engagement at the Metal Museum, the only such museum in the country. The museum's mission is to preserve, promote, and advance the art and craft of fine metalwork through exhibitions, collections, studio practice, and community education and engagement. It has over 3,000 items in its permanent collection, as well as a working smithy and foundry on site.



One such exhibition is their ongoing <u>Tributaries Series</u>. Derived from the Museum's location along the Mississippi, as well as from the focus of the exhibition series, Tributaries features artists whose work is beginning to have a significant impact on the metal arts community.

The museum actively promotes artists and their work and plays a vital role in the recognition and collection of metal work and the teaching of innovative practices. It is a place that serves an international community of artists and artisans creating work that is steadily building a strong following and creating an important place within the contemporary art dialogue.

#### Art in the Pearl is Back!

Art in the Pearl will return Labor Day weekend after a year off because of the pandemic. That's September 4–6, 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM on Saturday and Sunday and 10:00 AM–4:00 PM on Monday. Some of our artists will be selling at the show, and CMAG will share a metal arts demo tent with Greg Wilbur and blacksmith Caleb Booth.

The tent will be large, with plenty of room to work in. Anyone interested in demonstrating or talking about their making process can sign up for a shift of two or three hours. We aren't allowed to sell wares at the show, but we can hand out cards and show samples of our work, so it's a good marketing opportunity as well as a way to fulfill CMAG's commitment to education and public engagement.



Once we have a list of volunteers, we'll work out who brings what equipment – we'll have electricity and can use torches, and there will be security to guard tools left overnight. There will also be a break area with refreshments for artists. Metered parking is free on Monday because it's a holiday, which might affect your date selection.

## **Exhibit Review** by Madeleine Moore

#### Trude Parkinson: EVOCATIONS

Trude Parkinson's exhibition <u>Evocations</u> opened June 30th at the <u>Augen Gallery</u> and may be of particular interest to CMAG members. Parkinson uses Nihonga techniques with mineral pigments and oxidized silver leaf to create small-scale paintings that have the look of patinated or otherwise colored metal. Standing in front of the wall of little squares at the Augen Gallery is like viewing a marvelous collection of enamel samples or sheets of delicately oxidized brass or copper.

Parkinson writes of her technique:

I begin by oxidizing silver lead on paper, thinking of oxidation as destruction, the way our bodies age. Using the materials and processes of Japanese painting (Nihonga), I paint over the oxidized silver, building up an earthy surface of colored mineral pigments. Shapes suggest the human body, land, plants, sky, everything mutable. I ask, "What are you?"

My silverpoint drawings embody impermanence as their lines oxidize and darken. Impermanence is a theme in recent paintings where, inspired by Kintsugi, a Japanese method of repairing broken pottery, resulting in a stronger, more beautiful work of art, I began using gold leaf as a means of drawing and repairing.



It's a reminder that the boundaries between art disciplines are shaky, and a painter can use metal or bring to life the aesthetics of metal without being, strictly speaking, a metalsmith.

The Augen Gallery is located at 716 NW Davis and is open Wednesday–Sunday. The exhibition runs through July 31.
